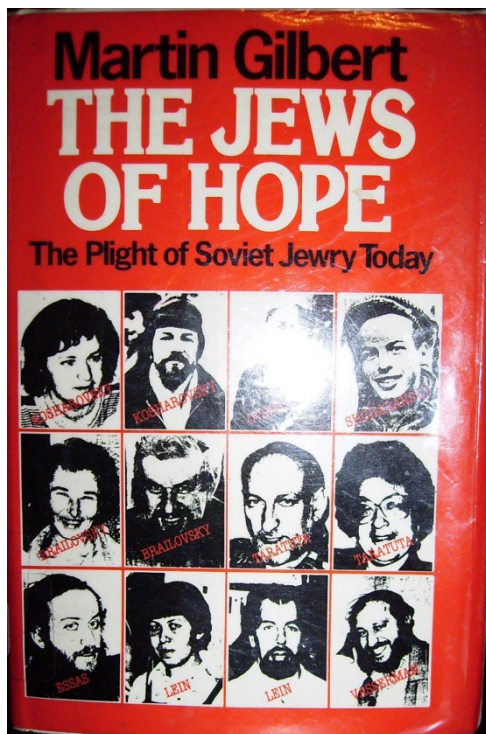


Jewish History Atlas by Martin Gilbert

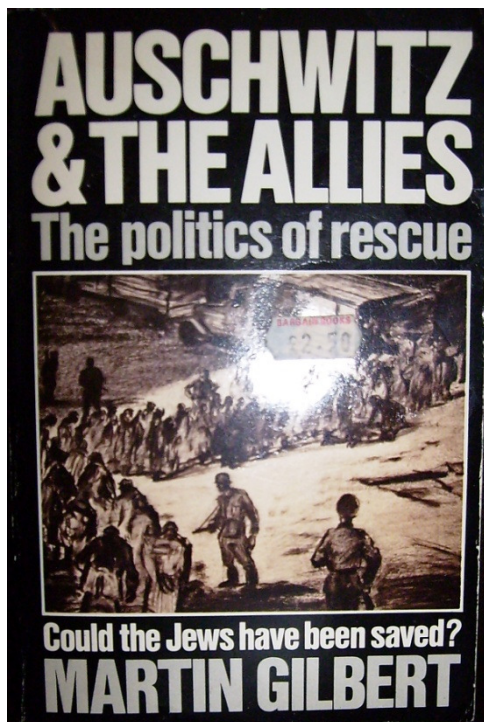
